"We offer a service that is more home-like because many things are stripped away in a sterile environment," Deidra Kearney said, noting that patients and family can decorate patient rooms with familiar knickknacks and mementos to help them feel more at

Accord has been offering services since the first part of July. Kearney has been in geriatrics for 16 years.

She said smaller communities like Show Low are often overlooked when it comes to hospice care and that is why she and others decided to start this one.

Kearney said sometimes patients have unfinished business of one sort or another they want to wrap up before they die, and that is one of the things Accord Hospice Care will strive to help them accomplish.

She noted that some families might be in crisis of one form or another during the time when a loved one is dying. Having a helping hand in the form of hospice

> She also pointed out that even if there is no crisis other than the loved one being close to death, the family may be overwhelmed by it all.

> "They can be steeped in the process of making arrangements and we will do all we can to make sure they get to go through the grieving process after doing all the tasks that have to be done and we will make monthly support contact with the family."

> Kearney said Accord staff will focus as much on the emotional needs of their patients as their clinical needs through things like massage (human touch), music and aromatherapy.

> She said touching engages the patient with the care provider, letting them know that someone cares how they are feeling.

> Kearney noted that they also strive to say "thank you" to veterans of military service, so they will know that the time they sacrificed away from friends and family is not forgotten.

> Staff will also work to help prepare the family for what is coming through counseling sessions with staff and/ or the Accord chaplain.

> Once a loved one has died, Accord Hospice Care staff will provide 12 months of bereavement care. according to Kearney.

> She noted that Accord Hospice Care is Community Health Accreditation Program-accredited.
